Prevention through Awareness & Vaccination

Deepalaya partnered with the All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS) to conduct an awareness drive on Cervical Cancer and the HPV vaccine under the government initiative 'Swasthya Nari Sashakt Parivar Abhiyaan' for more than two hundred women and girls from Deepalaya School and Learning Centre. The session that was held at Deepalaya School in Kalkaji Extension (DSKE) was led by the resource person from the Preventive Oncology Department of AIIMS, Mr. Mathew Varghese who addressed common misconceptions. Forty nine eligible girls from the cohort were provided HPV vaccine.

For this initiative, AIIMS felicitated CEO, Dr K. C. George for CEO of Deepalaya conducting vaccination drives for more then 800 girls and spreading awareness about cervical cancer.
